- Butte County COVID-19 grant to support non-profits: our grant was approved for entry into the lottery for funding. The county had \$900,000 available and received grant requests for \$2.5 million.
 Our grant application was not selected during the lottery drawing.
- AARP Grant completed and submitted. Asking for \$48,000 to
 develop grounds safety features (new ADA railings, etc.) for seniors,
 7 new benches along the walkway on the disc golf course to
 encourage seniors to walk and exercise, repairs of the cement
 around the Community Center, new lighted Exit Signs, a movable
 wall around the office in the Community Center and a series of
 classes about living successfully with wildfire, how to harden homes
 and forest management to reduce the risk of wildfire in the ruralurban interface.
- St. John's Episcopal Church is looking at supporting the mental health program. The national church has taken note of Magalia and our programs. Adventist Church is also interested in helping support the mental health programs. We are dealing with a lot of PTSD and fear about wildfire and these programs are important. Richard will follow-up.
